BY-LAW NO 99

To provide for draining certain parts of the Village of Richmond Hill, for the purpose of better preserving the health of the inhabitants residing in such parts, and for levying the necessary rates for the payment of the expenses attending the construction of said drainage.

Provisionally adopted the sixteenth day of July, A. D. 1883.

WHEREAS a majority in number of the owners, as shown by the last revised assessment roll, of the property hereinafter set forth, to be benefited by the drainage here proposed, have petitioned the Council of the Village of Richmond Hill, praying that in the interest of the sanitary condition of the Village, and for the prevention of Typhoid, Malarial Fevers and other diseases, you would pass a By-Law to levy a frontage tax sufficient to pay a local drain, not less than ten inches square, in the ditches on each side of Yonge street, from the North boundary of A. Wright and Sons south to the stone culvert crossing Yonge street, opposite Dufferin street, and on the west side of Yonge street from Richmond street north to said culvert, and that the work be proceeded with as soon as possible.

And whereas the Council of the Village of Richmond Hill, after a full and complete examination to be made by John T. Stokes, Esquire, being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained, and has also procured plans thereunto annexed and estimates of the work to be made by the said John T. Stokes, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefited by such drainage, stating as nearly as he can, the proportion of such drainage, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such drainage by every tract and lot of portion of the said assessment so made, and the report of the said John T. Stokes in respect thereof, and of the said drainage, being as follows:

Toronto, June 15th, 1883.

The Rovers and Council of Richmond Hill, Gentlemen—Having received instructions to make a survey of and estimate the cost of constructing certain drainage works in the Village of Richmond Hill, said works extending on the east side of Yonge street from the stone culvert on the north side of a lane on the east side of a point opposite the said north side of a lane, thence south to the south side of Dufferin street, also a drain across Yonge street to convey the drainage from the drain on the said west side to the head of Dufferin street.

I find the length of drain on the west side of the street to be 130 feet long, and that on the east side 82 feet, that on the west side 43 feet may be an 8 inch drain, while all the remainder should not be less than 12 inches internal diameter, excepting the piece crossing Yonge street being an additional length of 50 feet, which should not be less than 12 inches. I think, however, the culvert crossing Yonge street, opposite Dufferin street, may, by a little deepening, be utilized as an outlet drain.

The cost of such works should not exceed, for straight drain \$2.40 per yard, if constructed of wood, and the gutters at the north end, if constructed of wood with iron grating, should not exceed \$10.00 each, the wood for said gutters being 6 inches thick. I therefore estimate the cost of the works at the above rates.

The expense of erecting a drain of the kind proposed is as follows—For all those parts crossing streets, in the Village at large, for all those parts on the frontage opposite said drains, that is on the owners of said frontage in equal proportion per foot of frontage, all being equally benefited,—for that piece crossing Yonge street (if any be used) in the proportion which the said side street bears to the whole length of the Village at large, and the remainder on the frontage of the west side of Yonge street in proportion equal according to frontage, all being equally benefited.

As regards the owner of the lane on the north side of Mr. Wright's shop, his lane should be considered a part of the frontage and assessed accordingly, he being as much benefited as others adjoining.

He Reaps His Reward.
 CAREY, THE INFORMER, PAYS FOR HIS TREACHERY.

LONDON, July 30.—Intelligence has just been received that James Carey, the informer, was shot dead yesterday on the steamship Melrose, between Cape Town and Port Elizabeth, by a fellow-passenger named O'Donnell.

O'Donnell took passage here by the steamship Kinfauns Castle, which left Dartmouth on the 6th inst. for Capetown, where she transferred her passengers destined to Port Elizabeth, Natal and other coast ports to the steamship Melrose. The report of the shooting caused intense excitement in the west end of London and the House of Commons.

O'Donnell dogged Carey from London. Both sailed on the steamer Kinfauns Castle. The Government have little doubt that Carey was O'Donnell's man. They believe the former took the most elaborate measures to prevent his escape. According to the latest accounts the murder occurred at sea. Carey was not killed outright but died shortly after he had been shot. O'Donnell surrendered quietly. He was put in irons and surrendered to the police when the Melrose arrived at Port Elizabeth.

Carey was travelling under the name of Power. His family were with him. Carey embarked at Dartmouth. From Madeira he wrote to the authorities describing the voyage. He said he had shared in a conversation in which the invincibles and the miscreant Carey were specially denounced. He said he intended to forget that Ireland ever existed.

Later advices show that Carey was shot while landing from the Melrose at Port Elizabeth. O'Donnell was arrested. The Government had taken special and expensive measures to protect Carey.

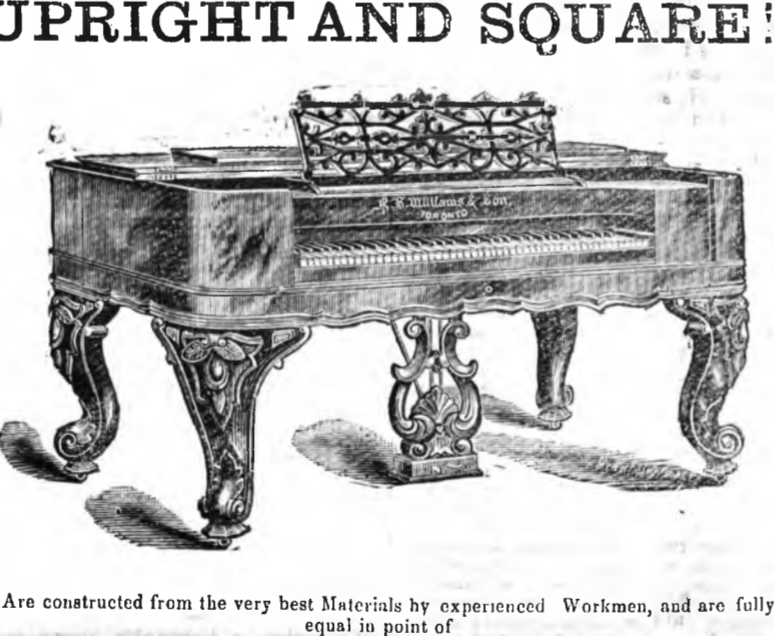
