

Canada Letter.
 We find the following letter addressed to the Editor of the Callaway Gazette:
 Near Toronto, Canada, July 24, 1883.
 ED GAZETTE:—A copy of the Gazette greeted me this morning, being the first thing from home since I left on the 10th. In this remote section where papers from the States are rarely seen, such thoughtfulness on your part has proven a treat.
 I am now sojourning in a lovely region of springs, fruits and limpid streams, sparkling fountains and placid lakes, about 12 miles north of Toronto, on Yonge Street. Toronto is a beautiful city. Its streets are broad, running at right angles and squarely with the corners. Its buildings are uniform in size and substantial in construction, and in good architectural taste. It is surrounded by a rich and productive country, and is doing a thriving business. The population now exceeds 100,000, and it continues to grow. I find everything much cheaper here than in the States. The best hotels in the city charge only \$2.50 a day, and in the country towns the best accommodations are furnished at \$1 per day. And the same articles may be had nearly every purchasable article—so much for low tariff.
 Crops of every description look well. The wheat exceeds any I have seen. Many fields yield from 50 to 40 bushels to the acre. The soil here seems specially adapted to the growth of timothy and clover. I have never witnessed such yield in any of the States of this commodity as I see here. But little attention is given to the production of corn. But little of it is fed here. The hogs are fattened on peas, the vines of which are fed to sleep in winter. The growth of fruit also receives its share of attention. Scarcely a farm is to be seen that hasn't its orchard of every variety of fruit trees, all well laden with choice fruit. The production of garden fruits and berries of every description is immense. Stock of every kind and of the best breeds is to be found here in abundance.—the Clydesdale seems to be the favorite with the farmers.
 Since my sojourn here the climate has been as mild and pleasant as May. The nights are pleasantly cool and comfortable. From the above you will conclude that I am basking in those elysian fields of "green pastures and still waters" of which we read. Well, this is more or less true, except when one is occasionally reminded of the "thorny path of life"—when brought in contact with the dragon tooth of a Canada thistle—of which I send you a sample, not, however, for distribution among your constituents.
 The fishing here is splendid, and as I now have a speckled trout biting at my hook, I must close my crude epistle.
