Speech by Sir John Macdonald.

When the Press Excursion arrived at Fraserville, near Cacouna, on Friday last, Sir John Mucdonald said he could address the company as an inhabitant and a proprietor in Riviere du Loup. He had beof Quebec, and hence his Liberal triends won dreadily understand how it was that French influence had unduly swayed him thating that time. (Laughter.) He used to be very much irritated, when he was a vounger man, at the assertion being made that he was sold to Lower Canada; but he had got over that since then, because he was now a Frenchman belonging to Lower Canada. Le had been afraid that even in his old days his subjection to French influences might result in his being ousted from the position he occupied; but he was reas-sured by that day's proceedings, because he found that his friends, the members of the Press from Ontario, were now all under the name influence that he was. (Hear, hear.) He hoped that his Onterio friends who had thus been captured during their visit to the Province of Quebec, would stay captured. There was, even in the lower St. Lawrence country, a large, happy, and contented population—a population governed by religious and moral influences. He (Sir John) had been charged with being very much attached to the French people. In the same way his deceased friend and colleague, Sir Geo. E. Cartier, had been charged in the other end of the province with being an Englishman. Those who were opposed to that gentleman in Lower Canada called him an Englishman, governed by John A. In Englishman, governed by John A. In Western Canada John A. was governed by George Ettienne. In his (Sir John's) opinion the loyalty of the French-Canadians to the Crown, to Canada, and to existing institutions was most marvellous; and he had not heard for many years a more just and eloquent tribute to that feeling on the part of the people of this province than had just been expressed by his friend the Rev. Dr. Dewart. He (Sir John) recommended the Ontario Pressmen to try the effect of this climate by residing for a short time on the shores of the St Lawrence. Nowhere did he himself find a climate which had such a testorative effect on his constitution as that where he was now temporarily sojourning. He felt sure that reunions of this sort must be productive of good When they found men of education and intelligence thinking tlifferently from themselves they would say "Perhaps we may not be so entirely right after all; perhaps we should not be so extreme in our opinions; perhaps we may compromise." He believed that under British institutions we must compromise.

By moderation, and by the honest use of their intellect by the workers of the Canadian press-by that judicious moderation which is the characteristic feature of free discussion—political freedom would grow and expand in this country. (Cheers.)




