THRESHING.—Mr. James Robinson did a big day's threshing last Monday, of fall wheat, but the yield was not nearly so good as last year, it only averaged about twenty bushels of wheat to the acre.

OATS THAT R. OATS.—Mr. Dan Lundy, of Pine Orchard, lot 27, con. 5, Whitechurch, has a field of oats that stand 6 feet 2 inches high, and on examining one head it was found to contain 164 kernels. Mr. Lundy is noted for such crops.

THE CROPS.—Farmers generally throughout Markham and Scarborough are well pleased with the crops, which, if the fine weather continues, will be fully one fifth above the average. Hay yielded fully fifty per cent. above the average; fall wheat is the poorest of any grain, except the Scott and Amber varieties, which are good and will average 18 bushels per acre; spring wheat in general will be a good average, about 14 bushels per acre, though slightly mided, except Wild Goose, which will yield very heavily—25 to 35 bushels per acre; they have all been housed in capital condition, and in No. 1 in quality; oats will yield very heavily; potatoes are a very poor crop, having been attacked by rot; apples and pears not more than half a crop, but enough for local consumption.
