## Spring Fair.

The East Riding of York and Markham Agricultural Societies' Spring Fair was held on the Fair Grounds, Markham Village, on Wednesday, April 30th. The attendance of visitors was very large, numbering about 2,000. There were 9 entries in Imported Draft Stallions, aged, all noble animals. Manfred, lately imported by Graham Bros., Claremont, was decidedly the favorite of a large majority of the horsemen, but was only awarded second prize by the Judges, which Mr. Graham declined to accept. Mr. P. G. Button's imported stallion, Howell, 3 years old, was also the favorite in his class with the majority of horsemen present. There were 2 entries in Imported Draft Stallions, 3 years old; 4 entries in Blood Stallions; 3 entries in Roadster Stallions; 9 entries in Canadian Draft Stallions, aged; 2 entries in Canadian Draft Stallions, 3 years old and under; 3 entries in Heavy Draft teams; 4 entries in General Purpose teams; 4 entries in Carriage teams; 6 entries in Driving horses; 2 entries in Saddle horses; 2 entries in Durham Bulls, aged; 5 entries in Durham Bulls, under 2 years old; 3 entries in Ayrshire Bulls; 2 entries in Jersey Bulls; 8 entries for sweep stakes; Running race, 3 entries; Hurdle race, 2 entries; Trotting race, 7 entries; Team race, 5 entries. 
