DECISION RENDERED.—The case of Ball and Co. Collins, that has been before the Courts since last October, has been finally settled by the Judge giving his decision in favour of Mr. Ballard. Mr. Collins to pay the costs. As near as we can recollect the points are as follows:—A stray horse came upon the premises of Mr. Ballard at Pine Orchard, which he properly advertised through these columns and also gave notice to the Township Clerk. Having waited considerably longer than the law requires for the owner to turn up, the horse was sold at auction, and after paying expenses the proceeds placed to the credit of the animal at the Township Clerk's Office. After this was all done the owner of the horse came along in the person of Mr. Collins, of Uzbridge Township. As he was not satisfied with the proceeds of the animal on deposit, he proceeded to prosecute Ballard on the following points:—1. The animal had been detained after a notice had appeared in the Daily Globe giving a description of the same; 2. The notice left for the clerk was not word for word with that published in the advertisement; 3. The notice was not left with the clerk till after the expiration of the time allowed by law; 4. The animal had been detained much longer than necessary, which increased the expense. The Solicitors defended the objections as follows:—1. Only one copy of the Daily Globe was received at the Pine Orchard Post Office, and it was entirely unknown that such advertisement had appeared; but the advertisement of a stray colt had been regularly inserted in a local paper as directed by law; 2. The entire substance of the advertisement was contained in the notice left with the Clerk; 3. Sunday intervened in the three days, and as the notice was left on Monday morning, the Sabbath should not be counted; 4. It was for the benefit of the owner that the sale was not hurried.—Eva.

OTTAWA, July 12.—The immigration returns for the Dominion for the month ending 30th June are as follows: Arrivals during the month of June, 1883, 28,511; during 1884, 21,710. Total arrivals from January 1, 1883, 93,285; for the same period of 1884, 81,131. Settlers in the Dominion during the month of June, 1883, 16,313; June, 1884, 12,402. Total settlers from January 1, 1884, 46,607. Passing through Canadian territory to the United States during the month of June, 1883, 12,198; during June, 1884, 9,308. Total to United States since 1st January to 30th June, 1883, 37,378; same period of 1884, 34,524.
