

#### A Very Serious Accident-

Mr Henry Bowers, in the employ of Wm Rolph, Esq., met his death on Saturday, 12th inst., being killed by a Jersey Bull. Mr. Bowers went into the pen occupied by the bull for the purpose of leading him out to water when the bull turned upon him and gored him in the right side-making a fearful gash. Death was almost instantaneous. Mr Bowers has been in this neighborhood for some years, bore an irreproachable character and leaves a wife to mourn his loss. Capt Rolph on hearing of the accident, immediately ordered the bull to be shot and buried, which order was obeyed within fifteen minutes after the tragic act took

It appears that Mr. Bowers, instead of taking the staff which was used with a snap on one end, to attach o the ring in the animal's nose, went into he stall were the bull run loose with his naked hand. The boy who was with him wanted him to take the staff but he said the bull would not hurt him, and on taking the ring in his hand for some reason the bull turned upon him as above stated, and the lacerated man was found outside of the barn door. He spoke, but soon became insensible and died in fifteen minutes. Capt Rolph feels the tragedyvery keenly, and we in common with the whole neighborhood extend our sympathy to Capt. Rolph and the sorrowing widow. Mr Bowers was a member of the Methodist Church, and for many years has been a devout Christian, commanding the respect of all who knew him. His remains were followed to the grave on Sunday last by all the leading people in Markham, as well as many sor-rowing friends from a distance.—Markham

## The Price of Wheat.

When a farmer finds wheat going down at this time of the year, he looks around the granary, finds he has a few loads to disnose of, and runs it into the market and sells at 10 and 15 cents a bushel less than he could have got nine months before. This waiting for prices to rise a few cents when s general average has been reached is a bad general average has been reached is a bad policy. In nine cases out of ten wheat reaches a maximum in October and November in this country. The hoarding of grain by farmers, heades running the risk of a depreciation price, loses by ratage and shrinkage; and when the interest on money is taken into consideration, ten cents a bushel would not cover the loss. It should be recollected that by railway and steambont facilities the productions of the world are to a certain extent equalized. When the great wheat growing area of the world is considered, and the various latitudes, it is evident that there is continual production going on-a continual harvest. Where a country over-produces in the first necessaries of life, these through the avenues of commerce gravitate to other parts where there is a demand. The law of supply and demand is as unerring in the long run as that of gravity—everything finds its level. The fall in the wheat market at the present time is owing to the prospects of an abundant harvest in the great wheat producing areas of the world. The Pacific slopes on this continent bave reaped, and India and Australia have now wheat in the market.


