

Agricultural Returns.

Summary of Agricultural returns to the Ontario Bureau of Industries—Aug 1st, atc. There is no some but will succomb to 1884.

The Fall Wheat appears to have made invaluable disssing for scalds, festers, etc. steady improvement throughout the season, Price twenty five cents at H. Sanderson & and in localities where it was regarded as Sons' Drug Store. hardly worth saving in May, good harvests

have been reaped. Spring Wheat, though not extensively cultivated in the Lake Eric Counties, is giving a remarkably good account of itself

It is teckened the Barley Crop will fall short this year half-million bushels. In the parts of the Province where the drought prevailed the Barley was short in both straw and heads, but the berry was plump and heavy. The most serious irjury to the crop was caused by the showery weather of the harvesting season, and over large areas the grain is more or less discolored-Oats-it is not expected that this year's crop of cars will equal last year's which was one of the best that the country has ever produced; yet for the greater part of the Province, the yield promises to be very

satisfactory
Rie is by no means a popular cereal gamong the great mass of the farmers of Ontario, owing to its unprofitableness as pears to be little or no disposition to increase the area devoted to its cultivation. Peas-this crop unless the prospects should be maried by very unfavorable weather, will be by far the largest and best that has been reaped in the Province

for a good many years.

Corn—the prospects this year are not very promising. Beans—the prospects of the crop where sown are good.

Roots-the reports on the root crops of he Province are varying. The Potato Crop promises to be very considerably above the average, both in quantity and Hay and Clover Crop has not quite ful-

of it. Yet, taking the Province as a whole, the yield, though inferior in bulk to last year, is very satisfactory.

Cold Production in Australia on the Decline.

The yield of gold for 1883 as reported by the Inspector of mines for New South Wales was 123,805 ounces, being less by 6717 ounces that that of the previous year. The number of men employed in the gold fields of New South Wales during the past year was 6742, not including 1008 chinamen. The production of silver showed an increase of 39,447 ounces over 1882, and the silver belt is stated to extend over twenty-five miles. A profit of from £8 to £17 per tou can be made by sending the silver one to England for reduction. A very considerable quantity of small diamonds (obtained by washing.) besides coal, iron, antimony ard lead, are also included among the mineral experts of the colony.

Of coal, the out-out hast year was 2,500,000. increase of 39,417 ounces over 1882, and Of coal, the out-put last year was 2 500,000 tons, which was small, considering that the coal area extends to 23,590 square miles.


