The Riel Affair of 1870.

The Grit organ is trying, in imitation of Sir Richard Cartwright, to make it appear that in 1870-71 Sir John Macdonald was the friend of Riel.

Notice to subscribers (continued) with date Ottawa, 27th Dec., 1871.

My Dear Lord Archbishop,—I have been able to make the arrangement for the individual that we have talked about.

The conclusion the organ comes to is as follows: "This evidence is absolutely conclusive.

Now the letter above quoted has done duty a thousand times, and that conclusion of the Globe's has become feeble with overuse and incapacity.

1. The letter in question was not a promise of an amnesty nor a condemnation of a crime.

2. The money so sent to Archbishop Tache was never used.

3. The dangerous state of the country was such that when the Grit Government of Ontario, in order to make political capital, offered a reward of \$5,000 for the arrest of Riel, there was an instant outcry from the people.

4. The speech of Sir John Macdonald in 1872, in which he expressed a wish to "catch him," was perfectly consistent with the letter we have quoted above.

5. In 1874 Mr. Mackenzie's Ministers were negotiating with Riel for an amnesty and trying to induce him not to become a candidate for Provost.

6. In that same year, 1874, Louis Riel was elected to Parliament for Provost.

7. In 1875 Mr. Mackenzie personally moved and carried a resolution by which Riel was to be amnestied after five years of exile.

The Drift of it.

The gerrymandering redistribution bill of Mr. Mowat cannot be better explained than the effect it will have on the Riding of Mr. Hess, of North Perth.

An exchange says:—"The excuse that the population must be made more equal and therefore something had to be done; but if the Government were honest in arranging the population the same end could have been arrived at by putting north east Hope with the balance of the same township already in the South Riding and leaving the North still a compact square; it would seem more natural to reunite the divided township than to take over a new one and leave half of a township in each riding, but what would be the effect of that? It would only increase the majorities for both members, making Hess perfectly safe, as well as Ballantyne.

It is but right to say, that notwithstanding appearances are against Hess for next election, he is not afraid. He thinks the result will be such feeling will come out of the manifest injustice of the act as to cause such a strong repulsion of feeling amongst his constituents as to place him once more in the Legislative Hall.

It is unfortunate that a carving and cutting of constituencies should be adopted. A fair and just expression of the people is certainly not obtained, and the result will be a demand to stop proceedings from the independent voters of the country demanding from the Government through their votes that no further such jobbed arrangements—as the Ridings of North and South Perth will present by the Bill recently introduced into the Local House—can be allowed.
