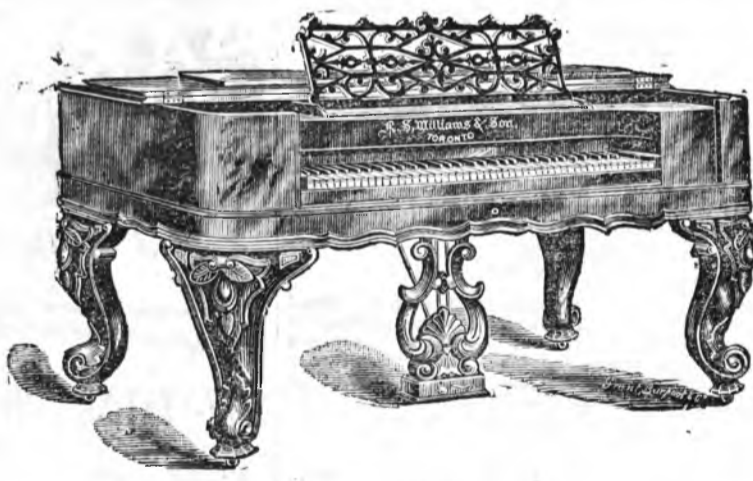

A Skillful Surgical Operation
