Toronto's Great Musical Festi- val.

THE GREATEST MUSICAL EVENT IN CANADA—
A CONGRESS OF MUSICAL NOTABILITIES—
—1,000 SELECTED SINGERS IN ONE
CHORUS—100 SELECTED MUSICIANS
IN ONE ORCHESTRA, AND A SUP-
PLEMENTARY CHORUS OF 1,200
CHILDREN.

On June 15, 16, 17, the City of Toronto
will join the ranks of those cities which
have shown themselves centres of art, cul-
ture, and enterprise. A monster Musical
Festival will be held during those days,
consisting of one matinee and three evening
concerts. It is owing to the energy
of Mr. F. H. Torrington, the Toronto
conductor of the Toronto Philharmonic
Society, that this great musical event has
been organized. An Association has been
formed of representative citizens of Tor-
onto, of which Mr. George Goodenham is
Honorary President; Mr. Samuel Nor-
dheimer, President; Messrs. James B.
Bousted, J. Herbert Mason, and Philip
Jacobi, Vice-Presidents; Mr. James Mc-
Gee, Treasurer; and Mr. John Earle, Hon-
orary Secretary. The public spirit and
energy of these gentlemen has resulted in
a guarantee fund of \$25,000 being raised,
and in the arrangement of programmes
which have never been excelled in any of
the large cities of the United States.

The immense Rink of the Caledonia
Curling Club on Mutual Street, which has
been rented for the Festival Concerts, will
be given by a chorus of a thousand voices,
selected from over twelve hundred appli-
cants, assisted by an orchestra of one hun-
dred musicians, selected in Canada and the
United States, while at one of the concerts
a chorus of twelve hundred children, se-
lected from the Publicists and Boarding
Schools, will be the chief attraction. These
choruses have been in active and enthusias-
tic rehearsal for the past four months, and
have reached a degree of efficiency which
augurs well for the artistic success of the
Festival.

The array of solo talent is no less im-
posing. Contracts have been made with
Frauella Lilli Lehmann, soprano of the
Court Opera, Berlin, Germany; Mrs. E.
Aline Osgood, of Philadelphia; and Mrs.
Gretchen Luther, of Buffalo, ladies who
stand in the front rank of oratorio sopranos
in America; Miss Agnes Huntington, of
New York, the ideal contralto of America;
Mr. Albert L. King, New York, the favorite
tenor; Mr. Max Heinrich, baritone of the
Theodore Thomas Conceris; and Mr. D.
M. Babcock, the greatest basso in America.

In addition to these celebrated vocalists,
the following instrumentalists have been en-
gaged: Herr Otto Bendix, Boston, pianist;
Mme. Josephine Chatterton, Chicago, har-
pist; Mr. Frederic Archer, New York,
organist; and Herr Henry Jacobsen, the
celebrated violinist.

The concerts will embrace: Tuesday
evening, June 15th, Gounod's great Sacred
Trilogy, "Miserere," "Death and Life,"
Wednesday afternoon, June 16th, Festival
Matinee, consisting of vocal and instru-
mental selections, Wednesday evening,
June 16th, Handel's sublime Oratorio,
"Israel in Egypt," Thursday evening,
June 17th, Children's Festival Jubilee and
Miscellaneous Concert.

Parties living at a distance may secure
reserved seats by application in writing,
enclosing the necessary funds in cash, P.
O. order, or bank draft to the Hon. Sec-
retary, John Earle, 14 Adelaide Street East,
Toronto, from whom officials programmes,
with plan of the hall, may also be obtained.

reach of all, being for season ticket (re-
served seat on ground floor) in all (four)
concerts, \$5.00; season ticket (reserved in
gallery) in all (four) concerts, \$5.50;
single ticket, reserved seat on ground floor,
each concert \$1.50; single ticket, re-
served seat in gallery, each concert, \$2.00;
single admission to each concert, \$1.00.

whether seats are wished on ground floor
or in gallery, and should be made early to
ensure good seats.
