A New Cruiser. A new cruiser called the "Yosemite" has been purchased in New York by the Dominion Government for the fisheries protection service, and the sum of \$45,000 has been paid for her.

This election was in a certain measure a test of public opinion on the Riel issue, and the Riel candidate carried the day by about 42 votes.
