He says: "I entered ______'s saloon about half-past six on Saturday evening to get a pint of lager, and the sight I saw there was enough to make a person sick. There must have been fully one hundred people in the place, and I do not believe ten more could have possibly It was a perfect jam, and those farthest from the door were making frantic efforts to get served, but the men in position would not yield a foot, as they knew that they had only a few minutes to "fill up," and there was no other saloon within six blocks. In the 'jug department,' where struggled to get my lager, there was a worse jam than in the bar, but the custom-ers were principally women, sent there in most cases by their brutes of husbands who, too proud to be seen carrying a 'growler' themselves, will permit their wives to do it for them, I saw several women in that crowd who could not have been less than seventy years of age, and I also saw several who had not reached womanhood, all wantng whiskey or beer. There were five bar-tenders waiting on the crowd, and the re-ceipts of the day over that bar, I was afterwards told, reached one hundred and fifty dollars. A year ago this saloon's Saturday's receipts would not reach fifty dollars. It got along all right with two bar-tenders, but two hotels within a few blocks having been cut off, has caused the extraordinary increase in business. You may think, Mr. Rounder, knowing me personally na you do, that there must have been a jam indeed, when I had to go away without getting my lager. Permit me in conclusion to express the hope that if the Fleming byaw for a further reduction of licenses passes, that the hundred who get heenses pay something handsome for them, for their profits will be something enormous." 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
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
