From Stouffville:—"In answer to your enquiry if the Market in this village is giving good satisfaction I answer Yes! Our citizens are glad because they can buy their stock of apples, potatoes, vegetables, fowl, butter and eggs direct from the farmer. The merchants are doing a much larger business now han before we had a Market."

We have not received an answer from Newmarket yet, but from our own knowledge and from what others have said, we know that they are well pleased with their undertaking. The farmers from miles around attend the Market there regularly, and the whole place is benefited by the large increase in busi-
