Canada's trade with the United States is shown by the trade and navigation tables just out. Our total ex-ports are \$89,189,000, of which we send to the United States \$43,522,000, or ported altogether \$115,224,000, of which the United States contributed \$50,537,440. Our total trade with the

neighboring Republic was, therefore, \$94,059,000. Increase of trade with the States over 1888, \$3,000,060. 
