At the recent meeting in this village in the Masonic Hall, Dr. Gilmour referred to a pamphlet addressed to "Facts for Irish Electors," and said, Mr. Meredith was the father and circulator of the same. Dr. Gilmour well-knows that oftentimes such kind of productions are gotten up by those of the opposite side and circulated with the thought that they may injure their opponents. If the doctor had wished to be straightforward in the matter, he might have stated that Mr. Meredith denied having anything to do with said pamphlet. We quote for the benefit of his hearers from the Globe of 27th March last, wherein Mr. Meredith in his place in Parliament (in reply to Mr. Awey who had charged him with getting up the pamphlet), "rose and said he had already denied responsibility for the pamphlet. He repeated now that he was not in any way responsible for this pamphlet, that he had not seen it, or heard of it until after the first discussion on the subject in the House." If Dr. Gilmour had wanted to do the fair thing and act honestly he would have given this denial of Mr. Meredith's upon this point. But it did not suit and therefore was not given.

### A Pigmean.

Owing to our being a day late this week we have time to say that the "genial young man" of the other sheet, has proved himself in this week's paper to be a person of pigmean stature and mind, and it is doubtful whether his sickly carcass would be value in the market for 400 cents let alone \$400. He is a fit representative of those who pay him for doing their dirty work. Evidently the HERALD hit hard last week.

From Don in Saturday Night.

On Tuesday night I listened to my old friend, my ideal friend, William Ralph Meredith, as he addressed an audience which was only limited by the size of the Pavilion. While he spoke, that immense audience, many of them standing, seemed so impressed by the message he had to deliver that each unseated auditor, as he grew tired, seemed careful to move from one foot to the other as noiselessly as possible. I would not allege that Mr. Meredith's rhetoric is of the sort which holds a listener spellbound, enraptured; it is not. It is the man, God doesn't make men like him every day. The nobility of his nature, the elevation of his character, the lively impulses which move him are attractive to everyone who does not rudely deny his own soul the right of judging of the worth of a man by those unerring instincts which make us acquainted with goodness and ability. I shall not attribute to him the cunning equipment of the politician; he lacks it. I have often wondered if he really possessed the astute mentality of the successful politician. He is so candid and so ingenuous, so unlike the ruck of politicians that one could not rate him without bearing all others. At the risk of seeming a devotee, I unhesitatingly pronounce him a brilliant exception to every other politician I ever knew. He is accessible without being cheap, companionable without being familiar, lovable without being effusive. His demeanor is that of the gentleman, yet his constituents call him "Bill" even while they, by every instinctive courtesy, treat him as their superior and let him know by every device of

affection that their familiarity is but a means of expressing in one word a feeling which would be cheapened if it found conventional expression.

### The Junction Meeting.

The meeting at the Junction on Saturday night was in every way a success in point of numbers, enthusiasm, and in accord with the views of the speakers of the evening.

There was one or two things which in our view took somewhat from the pleasure of attending. One was the disgraceful state of the road leading from Brockton into the town; quagmires, duck ponds and mud being the composite parts of the road leading into that flourishing town with the long name—a disgrace to any one horse corporation. The other was the hoarseness of the principal speaker of the evening, who from overwork was in bad voice.

Dr. Gilmour was not there. The World says: Sometime around the last elections he made application for admission to the Carlton Orange Lodge and his name is now on the books, but owing to the lateness of his application, or for some other reason, he did not become a member. And yet when he was asked at the Fairbank meeting the other day, whether he had ever tried to enter the Orange ranks, he replied "No."

Mr. Clendenen spoke first, dwelling on and supporting with arguments his platform as laid down by himself in his address to the electors.

Mr. J. S. Fullerton made a capital campaign speech. He was prepared to concede to every Roman Catholic what he believed he was entitled to. He was very sarcastic in reference to Mr. Mowat's action in granting his son the shrievalty of Toronto as well as the way in which the licenses were handled in the interests of the government of "truth and righteousness."

Mr. Wallace was received with marks of much favor. He pulled to pieces the present management of Ontario's finances. He referred to the parliament buildings' job as a huge swindle upon the Canadians, and a slap in the face to our Canadian architects—pointed out how the design of Darling & Curry for a building costing \$750,000 was far preferable to the one of the Buffalo architect, which will cost over \$2,000,000, and which has been accepted by the model Mowat Government. The hisses from the audience came in here fast and furious at the action of the government in this respect.

When Mr. Meredith at last stepped to the front the audience for fully five minutes cheered. He was suffering from a bad cold, but spoke, however, for an hour, in an eloquent manner. He showed up without mercy the falsity of the claim of Dr. Gilmour, that the government of Mr. Mowat was entitled to the honor of having conferred the manhood suffrage upon the people of Ontario. That the legislation to that step had been opposed for years by Mr. Mowat and that it was he and his followers in the Opposition who had forced the bill through the House. The speaker next referred to the manner in which Dr. Gilmour had taken credit upon himself for certain bills introduced into the House, especially with regard to a bill for the adjustment of disputes. It remains to this day, said the speaker, a dead letter upon the statute book. He also thought Dr. Gilmour very cheeky in claiming credit for the Factory Act and for the Employers Liability Act. In the year 1885 Mr. Meredith introduced in the Legislature the Employers' Liability Bill, and expected that it would have passed, but much to his surprise when the time came for the second reading, Mr. Fraser moved the six month's hoist, which means that it is not to be read at all. To show that they (the government) were unwilling that the Conservative party should have the credit for this, they brought in at the next session the same measure; but instead of calling it the 'Employer's Liability Act' they called it the 'Workmen's Compensation Act.' This was, of course, rushed through in short order, and here we have our brave Dr. Gilmour claiming the credit. Mr. Meredith also stated that Dr. Gilmour voted against Mr. Ingram's motion for the exemption of the income tax. Dealing with the proposed amendments to the Separate School Act he said: The language follows the flag, and so long as the banner of liberty floats above the heads of Canadians, English shall be taught in Ontario schools. After referring to other matters he said I have endeavored honestly to preserve my native land. I am here standing up for the civil rights of the people and I am ready to fall in the noble cause if it should be the will of the people. Mr. Meredith concluded with the following peroration:

I am fighting to advance the principles of civil rights. It would be imprudent for me to prophesy what the result of this election may be, but I can assure you that the pledges I make to the people of Ontario shall be fulfilled honorably, should you trust me with your confidence. If I find that I cannot fulfil my duties I will retire at once and restore to the people the trust they have placed in my hands. We are fighting in a noble cause. Our standard we raise on high is a grand one to fight under. I wish it had a more able leader, but may He who directs all things, direct you aright in the choice of a ruler for the next four years. The hall rang with the cheers of the audience at the conclusion of Mr. Meredith's speech. After speeches from the Mayor and E. B. Sheppard, the following resolution was put and carried:

That this meeting hereby expresses its approval of the platform so ably laid down by Mr. W. R. Meredith in his speeches in Parliament and before the electors of the Province, and pledges itself to support him in the coming contest against the present incompetent government.
