Municipal Elections.

The Lieutenant Govenor having appointed the Monday after Christmas as a public holiday, Municipal Officers seem to be undeeided as to when to hold the nominations. The 108th section of the Municipal Act is the section which is supposed to create the clifficulty. It is as follows:—"When the last Menday in December happens to be Christmas Day, the nomination of candidates for the offices of Mayor, Reeve, Deputy-Reeve, and Councillors in other municipalities, shall take place on the proceeding Friday at the times and in the manner per-scribed by law." This section provides what shall be done in the case the last Monday in December happens to be Christmas Day. As this year the last Monday in December happens to be the 26th of December, and not Christmas Day, the contingency provided for has not arisen. Nominations will therefore be held on Monday as usual, and no doubt but the public holiday will secure a larger attendance of the electors than is usually the case.
