UNBLUSHING EFFRINTERY.

The Mail, with alathe assurance of a better cause, came out a few days ago with an editorial headed "What the Government has done," claming the support at the people of the country for the present Government because it had removed cer tain burdensome duries, among oth ers that on tea and coffee, and stated that this would be of untold beneditto the consumers as a would immediately lower the price of the se articles, and therefore it was the daty of those benefitted to show their gratitude by giving them a hearty support. A more audacious piece of brazenfacedness could not ne imagined. We would ask, who imposed these burdensome taxes? Was it not Sic. Leonard l'mey? And what has been the contention of the Government organs, notably the Mail, as to the effect of the duty on these articles? PROHIBITION IN TAK NORTH WEST.

That the Prohibitory clauses against the intoxicating liquors in serted in the regulations for the government of the North West terrious, have not proved a dead letter is evident from the mets transpiring in the opening up of that vast region for settlement.

When the proposition for the annexation of a large portion of that jart of the North-West, West and North of Manitoba was strongly urged, the settlers almost vaanimons-Ly opposed it, appointing a Committee, with instructions to urgenily present the fact that a large number of settlers in the vailey of the Little Siskachewan had come from the order Provinces and located there in order to save themselves and families from temptations concomitant with the sale of intoxicating liquors; and that, as a community, they were of p sed to being made a part of the Fr wince of Man itoba, it its License Law for the sale of intoxication drinks was to be introduced into the North West. The Government realizing that it ould not be advisable to allow Manitoba to remain a seven by nine Province, when there was an excellent opportunity for its extension to a size worthy a place with the sister. provinces, and not gram the prayer oftne pentroperator non-an-aexation but arranged that when that part of the territory became Manitoba it retained its Prohibitory clauses, the go enment reserving the right to grant permits.

The mounted Police still carry out their original instructions, and swoop down on any unlucy vendor who is suspected of violating the Law, of whom several examples have recently been made to sing to the tune one hundred dollars each.

One of the schemos of gerrymandering spoken of in connection with the redistribution of the seats in the Commons is the taking of Stouffville from East York for the purpose of adding it to the North Riding. It is hoped by this means to defeat Mr. Mackenzie.

The bill to legalize marriage with a deceased wite's sister was passed by the House of Commons in Ottawa by a vote of 137 to 34. The Senate threw it out by a majority of one last session and 41 there is only one convert in the Senate the bill will become the law of the land.


