National Suberal Parliament.

The National Liberal Parliament. organized by the National Liberal Union. held its first meeting on Saturday even-ing in the l'hilharmonic Hall. The attendance of members and visitors was very fair and several ladies were present, as is usual at the opening of Parliament. For half an hour before the Speaker, Mr. J. M. Rese, took the chair, the scene around the clerk's table, at which members were entering their names for various constituencies, was interesting. After routine, the speaker read the address from the throne, printed copies of which had previously been distributed amongst the members. The address was an elaborate and thoroughly Parliamentary document, promising a large number of reforms, non-encroachment on Provincial rights, etc The reply was moved by Mr. Hay (Peel), and seconded by Mr. George Macdonald (Prince Edward), in very neat speeches. A vigorous attack was made by three of the Opposition, Messrs. Titus, J. G. Mowat and A. J. Jury, on the Government policy, which was ably defended by Ald. Hallam, J. A. Proctor and Mr. Tait. The debate was characterized by several amusing passages at arms, which provoked con-siderable merriment. The House ad journed at 11 p. m., till Friday night when the debate on the address will be continued. The Government and the Opposition are nearly equal in numbers; a fact which heightens the interest of the spectators in what promises to be a very entertaining and instructivo series of discussions on the political affairs of the country.


