Professor Wiggins has written the Minister of Marine, the Governor General and the President of the United States concerning the safety of shipping, concerning which he says: "No vessel, whatever her dimensions, will be safe out of harbor, and none of small tonnage can hope to survive the tidal wave and fury of this tempest."

The Hamilton Administration (Conservative) of New Brunswick, has been turned out by the Liberals by a vote of want of confidence of 22 to 18. Mr. Blair, member for York, and leader of the Opposition has been called to form a Government.
