At the Sons of England's pic-nic, a number of the Brocton roughs came on the Ground and behaved in a most ruffianly manner. An effort was made by the proprietor of the Ground during the afternoon to put them out, and a fight ensued in which the Brocton youths came out second best. They returned to Dr. Fisher's, near the West Toronto Junction, to repair damages. They next visited the Hotel, but being refused liquor. they commenced to wreck the house and abuse the inmates. At this juncture, Constable Brown came on the scene, and succeeded after a hard tussle in arresting five of them, procured a conveyance and landed them about 11 o'clock in the Weston lock-up. Tuesday morning, Justices Tyrrell and Cruickshank held a Court and promptly ordered them to contribute to the funds of the County and cost the aggregate sum of \$84.59, or in default thereof, thirty days each. The names of those convicted were Daniel Wood, Thomas Jordan, Nicholas H. Davin, James Randal and Thomas Grey; Daniel Wood paid the fine, the others were sent down.

Joseph Hollinsworth, late an employe of the Woollen Mills here, having accepted a similar situation in Messrs. Phillips & Berrey's Mill at Lambton, returned on Thursday with a team to remove his family. On proceeding down the hill on Dundas St. entering the village, a portion of the furniture fell off the load, frightening the horses which ran down the hill at a terrific rate. When opposite Hunwick's Hotel sheds, they suddenly wheeled toward them, upsetting the load and hurling the occupants, Mr. McDonald, driver, Mr. and Mrs. Hollingsworth and three children, off the waggon with terrible force on the ground. Those present rendered immediate assistance in extricating the unfortunate family, who were under the furniture and all badly hurt, Mrs. Hollingsworth fatally, she never regaining consciousness and died about an hour after the accident. Mr. Hollingsworth and the children, though badly bruised, are fast recovering. The driver, who, by the way, appears to have acted with great courage and presence of mind, came off with scarcely a scratch. Mrs. F. A. Howland, who happened to be passing when the accident happened, and several other ladies near the scene, behaved to the sufferers in the most praiseworthy manner, as did every one, the village demonstrating their sympathy in the most tangible way by subscribing a handsome sum to defray funeral and necessary expenses, and support the children until the father is able to
