Wallace Bros. is still in the grain business, buying all kinds of grain at their mill; their flour is giving good satisfaction. Mr. Hollands, the miller, understands his work well.

Mr. George Wallace has built a large elevator and grain warehouse at the C. P. R. Station, and will do a rushing business in the grain line.

Mr. John McClure is talking of taking out a license for auctioneer this fall; there is one very much needed in this part. It will be a help to him in the way of making a living.

A meeting of the Reform Association of Woodbridge was held in the Temperance Hall on Friday, Sept. 12th. Mr. N. J. Stong was elected Chairman, and M. Burkholder, Secretary.
