Scott Act Petitions.

Petitions are being circulated by the opponents of the Scott Act, praying for an alteration in the law, so as to require the poliing of a three-fifths majority vote in favor good building timber, Soft wood, Cedar posts of the Act before it can be brought into operation. To counteract this, at a meeting of the Executive committee of the Dominton Alliance it was unanimously resolved to issue counter petitions, asking that no change may be made in the Scott Act that would make it less effective, or that would make it more difficult to secure its adoption or enforcement. It was also resolved to embody in the same prayer a petition for the total prohibition of the fiquor traffic.
