Moved by Mr. Cook, seconded by Mr. Malloy, that the Cleak and Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to retain out of the funds of the township the sum of \$6.00, for drawing deeds, &c., for Farr, for deviation of road -Carried.

Moved by Mr. Elliott, seconded by Mr. Reaman, that whereas D Fotheringham, Esq., P. S. I. for North York, in making the apportionment of the Municipal Grant to schools for the year 1885 for the Township of Vaughan, wrongly apportioned to the village of Woodbridge out of said Grant the sum of \$122; therefore the Council of the Municipality of the Township of Vaughan requests that he will take immediate means whereby said amount will be refunded to the Township, and the Clerk is hereby instructed to forward a copy of this resolution to Mr. Fotheringham.—Carried. The following By-Laws were passed:-

By-Law No. 480 apportioning the interest accrued from the Municipal Loan Fund to the various School Sections and Union School Sections.

By-Law No. 481 apportioning the interest accrued from the Clergy Reserve Fund.

By-Law No. 482 closing and disposing of road allowance 33ft. wide between lots 31 and 32, in the village of Kleinburg. By-Law No. 483 opening and establishing road on southerly part of town lot 31 in the village of Kleinburg.

By-Law No. 484 closing up and dispesing of road allowance between lots 20 and 21 on the 7th Con.

By-Law No. 485 opening and establishiging a road on the north half of lot 20 in the 7th Con.

The Council then adjourned till Tuesday, the 10th day of March next.
