BEST AFTER EATING.

The experiment of Jules Virez settled the question as to the non-digestion of food in default of rest. He selected two cubs of the same size, age, and general physique, made them fast a day, and treated them next morning to a square meal of potato chips and cubes of fat mutton; but as soon as one of them had eaten his fill, he made the other stop, too.

It does not follow from this that a horse may not be harnessed soon, or immediately after eating, when occasion calls, with the probability that no harm will result, provided the pace be moderate, and due care be taken not to overdrive.

Providing always the horse be liberally, that is sufficiently fed, the time of feeding is of small account compared with the vital necessity of obeying this natural law in order to prevent indigestion.
