Pursuant to the judgment of the Chancery Division of the U.S. Court of Justice, in the matter of Timothy Rogers, deceased, Executors Rogers, and with the approval of the Master in Chancery, there will be offered for sale in one parcel, by public auction, by J.C. Stokes, Auctioneer, at the Queen's Hotel, in the village of Aurora on Saturday the 6th day of November, 1886, at the hour of 2 o'clock in the afternoon, the following freehold property, namely—Lot number eleven in the second concession of the Township of King, containing 200 acres, excepting thereout four small parcels, amounting in all to about five acres, heretofore sold and conveyed. The property is the farm of the late Timothy Rogers, of the Township of King, and is to be sold subject to a lease made in his lifetime, which will expire on the 1st April, 1890, the lessee paying an annual rent of \$450 and all taxes.

The purchaser will be entitled to the rent from the day on which he pays his purchase money. There are about three acres of bearing fruit trees, and about thirty acres of bush, timbered principally with hardwood. The remainder is good pasture land, and the whole lot is enclosed by good fences.

Upon the farm are built a brick dwelling-house, a large barn, and good sheds, stables and outbuildings, in good repair. The soil is generally a good clay loam. There are two wells and two cisterns on the farm. It is distant from King station three miles, from Aurora five miles, and from Newmarket one mile. The property will be sold subject to the lease above mentioned, and a reserved life estate by the Master.

The vendors will not be required to produce any title deeds, or copies thereof, or evidences of title, or furnish any abstract other than those in their possession. The other conditions of sale are the standing conditions of the Court. Ten per cent. of the purchase money is to be paid down as a deposit to the vendors, their solicitors or the firm of sale, and the balance within one month thereafter, without interest, into Court to the credit of this matter.
