NEWS ITEMS.

Saturday was the hottest July day
known for many years on this continent.

Mr. Jones, Conservative candidate, has
been elected for the Commons, in Digby,
by a majority of 31.

The Irish Crimes Bill has received the
Royal assent and it is now one of the
laws of the realm.

Eleven dead and about 100 injured are
the latest returns from the St. Thomas
disaster. Many more deaths are expected.

Application has been made to compel
acting Magistrate Baxter to sign the
warrant for Mr. E. E. Sheppard's arrest,
for libelling the 65th battalion of Mont-
real.

The will of the late Mr. G. D. Morse,
whose body was found in the Toronto bay
a few weeks ago, shows the deceased
gentleman to have been worth \$100,000.
The property is left to his widow and two
sons.

The time for cancelling the 74 licenses
affected by the passing of the Fleming
By-Law in the city of Toronto takes
place on the 31st inst. Inspector Dexter
has notified each of the 74 that the law
must be strictly enforced.
