Delicacy of the Sense of Smell.

A curious series of experiments has just been completed by Drs. Emil Fischer and Penzoldt upon the sensitiveness of the sense of smell. These chemists used mercaptan and chlorphenol as their odoriferous substances, and experimented in a room of 230 cubic meters capacity. A gramme of the substance was dissolved in a liter of alcohol: 5 c. c. of the solution were again diluted to a known volume, and 1-3 c. c. of the latter solution measured out into a flask from which a fine jet could be directed by the experimenter to all parts of the room, the air of which was subsequently agitated by the waving of a flag.
