Our Toronto Letter.

Although as I mentioned in my last letter a number of our citizens have left town for the summer months, we are often favored with visits from those of other parts. Among the prominent men who during the last few weeks have arrived at Toronto is the Hon. John Sherman who is one of the two representatives from the state of Ohio in the United States senate. I hardly need remind your readers that the Senate of the United States is a far different body from the Senate at Ottawa. Its members are elected by the different State Legislatures at different times, and hold office for six years, one third retiring every two years. Each one receives a salary of \$8000.00 annually. The body is presided over by the Vice President of the United States, or if he be dead, or if tor some other cause the office be vacant then by a member of the body duly elected. It is probably the ablest legislative body in the world. The leading men in the different states naturally aspire to seats in it and some of its members or exmembers are usually the chief candidates for presedential honors. Upon the death of Vice President Hendricks, Senator Sherman was I believe offered the posttion of presiding officer, but for some reason declined. The Republicans of Ohio at their state convention held last week presented Sherman's name as a candidate for the Presidency, the election to which posnion will be held a year from next November.
