

Toronto's Exhibition

The Industrial will open in Toronto on Monday next. The following is a synopsis of the programme for the first week:

MONDAY, Sept. 10th.—Preparation day—All exhibits of the first week must be in their places, properly displayed by 6 p. m. Only exhibitors and their assistants admitted on this day.

TUESDAY.—Grand Opening Ceremonies—The Exhibition will be officially opened by His Excellency, the Governor-General, Lord Stanley, at 2 p. m. This will be followed by speeding in the horse ring, and special exhibitions by the Viennese Lady Fencers, performances on the high rope, dog, cat and monkey circus in front of Grand Stand, bicycle contest between Miss Jessie Oakes, of England, and Miss Von Blumen, of the United States.

WEDNESDAY.—Bicycle and Athletic Day.—Trotting races in the afternoon; amateur bicycle races, foot races, dog races, &c. Band concerts by "O" Company Infantry School Band. Several of 2nd day's performances will be repeated.

THURSDAY.—Stock Breeders' Day.—Exhibits and competition for large sweepstake prizes for all classes of horses and their progeny. International Tableau and Danes. First balloon ascension. Magnificent illumination of the grounds in the evening, with thousands of Prismatic Lamps and Chinese Lanterns and special devices. First Grand Display of Fireworks by Messrs Pain & Sons, of London, England, followed by the "Siege of Sebastopol," a most realistic representation of the last act in the great Crimean War.

FRIDAY.—School Children's Day.—Additional special features for both old and young. Drill competitions, Band of the Governor General's Body Guard, and Prof. Tomlinson's Exhibition Band.

SATURDAY.—Societies' Day.—Hurdle Races for the Hunt Club Cup, under the auspices of the Toronto Hunt Club. Exhibition of Tandems and Boy Riders' competition. Aerobic and Gymnastic entertainments. Illumination of the grounds from 7 till 10 p. m.
