Sir Charles Tupper sails for Canada today. The "Lemon Cup," representing the curling championship of York County Clubs, was won on Saturday by Scarborough.

The House of Commons came to a vote on Wednesday of last week on Mr. Mulock's motion to remove the duty on fertilizers. The Government's majority was 30.

Sir John Macdonald has decided to reconsider the matter regarding kit allowance to the York-Simcoe battalion, during the North-west rebellion.

Sir Richard Cartwright's motion in favor of Canada having power to make her own commercial treaties, was debated in the House of Commons on Monday, and voted down by 94 to 66.
