" It is reported here that a movement is now on foot in the Township of York to give free right of way to the York Township electric railway over private property, and that it is proposed the line should end at Newton Brook. People here are furious at the way Mr. Forster and Russell have acted, and very severe lemarks are made about Mr. Pugsley also."


