It is rumored that the Prince of Wales will shortly visit Ottawa. The object of his visit to the capital of the Dominion has not been divulged.

The Empire of Friday said that the city clerk had been applied to by the government statistician at Ottawa for the particulars of the population, etc., of the recent annexations to the city, so that the constituencies of East and West York may be readjusted.

The Toronto Street Railway Company are pressing the city council for a decision as to what system of electricity they wish them to introduce. Their tender, they say, was based on the electrical system, and not on the continuation of a horse railway. The railway managers say that unless prompt action is taken the citizens will be deprived of rapid transit for another year.




