### Corgeons Temples in a Land Where Famine Lurks.

We hear but little of the Greek Church, but it has one of the most lively religions in the world to-day, and the holy synod of Russia has a capital of \$25,000,000, and its income is something like \$6,000,000 a year. I visited one morning the Church of Our Saviour, which surpasses in beauty any church of modern times. It was built to commemorate the deliverance of Moscow from the French, and it has cost about \$40,-000,000. It stands on the banks of Moscow River just outside the Kremlin, and its great dome may be seen blazing out under the sun from any part of Moscow.

It took 900 pounds of gold to plate this dome, and there is more than \$1,000,000 worth of gold upon it. This dome is in the shape of an inverted Bermuda onion, and if you can imagine an onion of gold, the top of which is just 100 feet in diameter, you may get some idea of this \$1,000,000 golden onion which crowns the Church of Our

Saviour. The cupolas cost \$800,000 to gild, and there are bells within this church which one here cost \$800,000, and it weighs just thirteen tons.






