

### Markham Council.

The Council of the Municipality of the Township of Markham met at 10.30 a. m. Members all present. Reeve in the chair.

Slater—Scott—that the treasurer pay J. Graham \$2.20 for repairing culvert and road plane.—Carried.

Reesor—Lawrie—that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Chas. Cook the sum of \$7 for putting in culvert on 10th con. opp-site lot 5 as ordered by the overseer interested.—Carried.

Scott—Reesor—that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Frank Nicholls the sum of \$208.87 for putting 264 yds. gravel on sideline between lots 20 and 21, con. 3, parties interested having done a like amount gratuitously.—Carried.

Reesor—Scott—that the time for returning the Collector's Rolls be extended to the first day of February, 1893.—Carried.

Lawrie—Scott—that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the following accounts for gravel as certified by the several overseers:

Robt. Bruce, 85 yds., \$3.50; C. P. Reid, 468 yds., \$46.80; W. Barton, 35 yds., \$3.50; W. A. R. Milne, 87 yds., \$8.70; Lindsay Estate, 22 yds., \$2.20; Wm. Scarce, 17 yds., \$1.70.—Carried.

Slater—Scott—that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Arthur Muldon the sum of \$7, being value of one ewe lamb killed by dog or dogs, owners of which are unknown as testified upon oath.—Carried.

Lawrie—Reesor—that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay R. Barker the sum of \$1.50, being the amount for repairing culvert, lots 14 and 15, Con. 10.—Carried.

Scott—Lawrie—that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the following accounts for printing:

H. R. Corson—500 Collectors' certificates, \$2.50; 50 Municipal By Laws, \$4. T. F. McMahon—Advertising Markham Township Council meetings for one year, \$6.00.—Carried.

Slater—Scott—that the treasurer be and is hereby authorized to refund the following taxes, assessments, having been duplicated:

Scott—Reesor—that the treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Mrs. Johnson, who is in needy circumstances, the sum of \$2.50 per month during the pleasure of this council.—Carried.

Slater—Slater—that the clerk have 150 copies of the treasurer's financial statement for the year ending Dec. 13th, 1892, printed immediately for distribution.—Carried.

Scott—Lawrie—that the council do now adjourn sine die.—Carried.

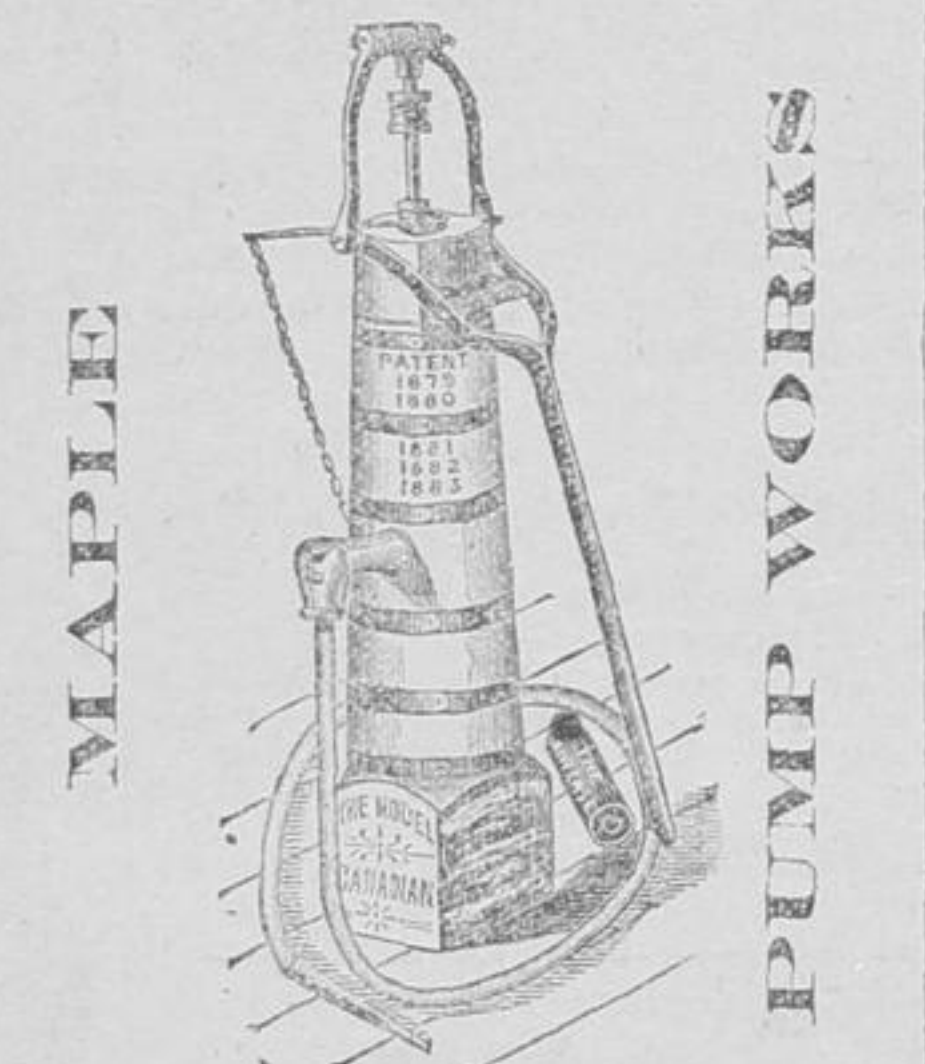
