

Markham Council.

Pursuant to the statute the new council of the township of Markham for the year 1893, met at Unionville on Monday, Jan. 18th, at 11 a. m.

Present: Messrs. Slater, Scott, Reesor, Lawrie and Quantz. After each taking the declaration of office and of qualification as the law directs, the reeve took the chair and addresses were delivered by each member.

Applications were received from Thos. Thomson and D. B. Nighswander for the assessorships.

Lawrie—Scott—moved that the treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Henry Byer \$248 for 31 yards of gravel put in division 78; Henry Groove, R. O.—Carried.

Reesor—Lawrie—moved that the treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Charles A. Patton the sum of \$13.83 for repairing two culverts on 9th Con., opposite lot 10.—Carried.

Scott—Reesor—moved that the treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the following sums being two-thirds the value of sheep killed or injured by dog or dogs unknown:—A. Hood, 3 killed, \$18.84; J. D. Harrington, 1 injured, \$3.—Carried.

Quantz—Lawrie—moved that the reeve be a commissioner to get 5 toise of stone broken on Pomona Road, amount payable on his order when the job is completed.—Carried.

Scott—Lawrie—moved that the treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Jacob Eyer the sum of \$66.90 for putting 150 yards of gravel on road division 5, parties interested having done a like amount gratuitously; also the sum of \$7.25 for opening and tile draining pit.—Carried.

Quantz—Lawrie—moved that Mr. Scott be a commissioner to purchase cedar to be delivered at Victoria Square and Brown's Corners; also to examine cedar at Unionville and purchase what is suitable for this municipality, the amount for the same to be payable on his order.—Carried.

Scott—Quantz—moved that the treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the following accounts for gravel:—S. Miller, 54 yards, \$5.40; C. P. Reade, 316 yards, \$31.60.—Carried.

Scott—Reesor—moved that the treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Corson & Son, for printing 150 financial statements, \$19.80; press work, \$2.50; 2080 ballots, \$10; total, \$32.30.—Carried.

Quantz—Reesor—moved that when this council adjourns it stands adjourned until Saturday, Feb. 18.—Carried.

Lawrie—Scott—moved that Mr. Reesor be appointed a commissioner to enquire into the condition of the Harper family, and if necessary grant them assistance, amount not to exceed \$10.—Carried.

Mr. Reesor asked leave to introduce a by-law to appoint auditors and assessors; leave given. The by-law then received its several readings and passed.

Mr. Scott asked leave to introduce a by-law to appoint a Board of Health for 1893; leave given. The by-law received its several readings and passed.

Council adjourned.

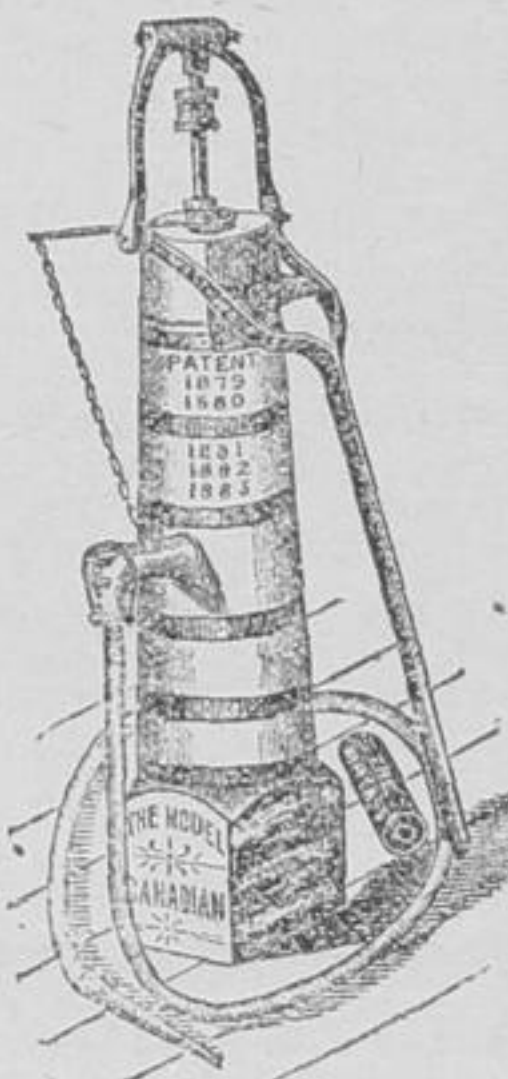
