Vaughan township was honored on Tuesday by the election of its Reeve, Mr. Andrew S. Russell, as Warden for the County of York. There were three other candidates for the position, viz., S. T. Humberstone, reeve of York; J. C. Stokes, reeve of King, and D. G. Stephenson, reeve of East Toronto. Every member of the council was present, and Mr. Russell got a vote of 27 to 21, on the first ballot cast for him. The Warden on being conducted to his seat by his mover and seconder—Messrs. J. D. Evans, reeve of Etobicoke, and Jonathan Slater, reeve of Markham township, thanked the members of the council for the trust reposed in him, and expressed the hope that he would not abuse their confidence. He then briefly outlined the important work for the session. Mr. Russell is to be congratulated on his being elevated by his colleagues to the highest office in the gift of the County Council.

We notice by an exchange that a copy of the Act respecting the use of tobacco to minors, has been placed in the hands of every school teacher, with instructions to make suitable comments thereon occasionally.
