For the Kelly Cup,

competition for a silver cup donated by
Mr. John Kelly, of the Palmer House.
Four teams entered the contest for the
trophy, which was finally won by Brad-

watched eagerly every shot made. In
the morning Aurora succumbed to Brad-

York in the afternoon, and in the evening

The Rifle.
The third shoot of the series of the
Dominion Off Hand Rifle Association of
this district was held at Maple range on
Saturday, Feb. 4th, between the King
City and Vaughan teams, resulting in a
victory for the visitors. This is the sec-
ond in succession, although the home
team in this, as in the last match, made
the highest score at 100 yards.

The rivalry between the teams is of a
very pleasant nature, as at each match
there is much of that pleasantry which
makes sport of this kind or any kind, en-
trancing—the "rattling" of members
with a "bull's eye" or a "goose egg,"
frequently occur.
The saying "There is nothing new under
the sun" is verified in this shoot, as
we find by a work—published in 1808—
recently brought to our notice, that rifle
shooting was in vogue then, and that
with the exception of the arm used, their
sights, position, rules, terms, such as
bull's eye, 4 o'clock, high right, or left
of the bull, and that they used a disc
and stickers, as now, seems surprising. We
have further reason to believe that the
present improvement on their crude arms
has not materially increased the accuracy
of the shooter to the extent that it should
if the shoot was better recognized by the
Federal Powers.
The Executive of the Association meets
this week in Toronto with a view of ap-
proaching the Federal Government, call-
ing their attention to the revival of this
old-time sport, praying to become recog-
nized by them, and participate in any
benefits that would accrue from such
recognition or affiliation. As there are
eleven or more districts, with about
twenty clubs, some clubs having two or
more teams of six men each, with a
little fostering by the Government, would
soon develop into a strong body.

Palmer, that Mr. Rumble's offer be ac-
cepted, and that he be requested to de-
liver fifty yards of gravel on the terms
stated.—Carried.
The clerk was instructed to write to
Mr. Henry Marsh and learn from him
what his price will be for two inch plank
and 3x4 scantling—all of pine—delivered
in Richmond Hill as soon as possible.
The council adjourned.

"The Metropolitan Railway Company";
