**THE RELIGIOUS CRY REVIVED.**

It is unfortunate that before every general election in Ontario, in fact previous to almost every bye election, the campaign turns into something like a religious war. It seems strange that this should be so in this enlightened nineteenth century with all the boasted advances in civilization and christianity.

For months past scores of letters have appeared in public journals which to the careless reader went to show that the Roman Catholics of Ontario were steadily making encroachments, and that the Mowat Administration were almost entirely at their mercy. It is as humiliating to write on this subject as it must be annoying to our Roman Catholic fellow citizens to be always put on the defensive. Previous to one election frantic efforts are made to prove to Protestants that the Bible is mutilated in order to satisfy a certain church, and at another time the cry is raised that Separate Schools must be abolished in this Province. So much has recently been said that it was found necessary to make a statement as to the number of Protestants and Catholics appointed to office by the Provincial Government. The statement which appeared in the Globe of Saturday last was no newspaper article which could be refuted, as each statement appeared over the signature of the Deputy Minister, or high official in each department. According to the returns obtained in June, 1889 (the last returns obtained), the Division Court Clerks appointed by the Government were 166; of these 154 were Protestants and 12 were Catholics. Old Division Court Clerks appointed by Judges under the old law were 151; of these 144 were Protestants and 7 Catholics.

Of bailiffs, 191 were appointed by the Government, viz.:—164 Protestants and 37 Catholics, and 140 were appointed by Judges under the old law, viz.: 126 Protestants and 14 Catholics.

We ask our readers to peruse the above official statement and see if the result is an evidence that Protestantism is in danger in this province.

Last week THE LIBERAL criticized some remarks alleged to have been made by Mr. Geo. Syme at an Orange banquet held in Toronto Junction a short time before. We gave as our authority the York Tribune which journal appears to have been correct in its reference to Mr. Syme's speech. However, as the gentleman says that his political remarks were only made in a jocular way, and were not intended to be taken seriously, we think it is

only fair to make this explanation. Like our cotem., had we known that what Mr. Syme said in his after-supper speech on the occasion referred to was only made by way of a joke we would not have criticized his remarks.
