city, he writes, "I never saw them use their destructive weapons except in procuring food and as a means of defence when attacked. Naturally they do not like to be handled, but when one lets them run over the hand they do not try to sting; they hurry away, seeming to want to get on a more congenial surface than the human skin.

"It has been said that in captivity they become cannibals and kill and eat each other. I saw them live together cheerfully, and apparently understanding each other very well. Only once did I see a large one eating a little one, and then I think the little one died a natural death. Like many other animals, they can be excited to combat by artificial means, but I never saw such battles have any serious consequences. 
