## HE HAD A DESIRE TO DIE.

A Canadian's Attempt at Suicide in Minneapolis-Poisoned Himself.

News of a well-known Belleville, Ont., man's attempt to commit suicide has just come to hand. A Minneapolis, Minn., de-

made a desperate attempt to commit suicide in the lodging rooms over Hamilton's sa. ing. loon, 112 Washington avenue south. He was discovered about 2 o'clock in violent convulsions and suffering terrible pain. Dr. H. S. Nelson was called, who worked over him for hours and finally succeeded in saving his life. When the doctor first came he refused to tell what kind of poison he had it is sure, safe and painless. Like every taken, as he did not wish anything done to save his life. "I want to die," he said, "but give me something to relieve the pain." He finally stated that he had swallowed a two grain capsule of strychnine about 11 hours before. Large doses of morphine and chloroform were administered, and by working his arms, etc., the tetanic contractions of the muscles were overcome. Had the poison been taken without the capsule, death would have resulted in a short going to the grave, and I am very thankful | time, but the capsule prevented the strychnine from taking effect until some time had elapsed. The victim expressed sorrow that his suicidal attempt had been frustrated.

The man is about 55 years of age and came from Belleville, Ont. He stated that this is his fourth attempt at suicide, but promised the doctor that he will not try it again. His despondency was caused by financial reverses. He comes of a good family. His father was rich, and after the division of the property, over which there was some trouble, he lost or spent his inheritance. He does not wish to apply to his relatives for aid, "and I am too proud to beg," he remarked. Last evening the patient was much better, practically out of danger, and to-day will be removed to the home of a friend in the city.


