NOTES ON THE RAILWAY.

A gang of men started work at the southern boundary of the village on Monday morning, and made a good showing during the day. The plowing was a difficult task owing to the many large stones wedged in the side of the road. There were three strong men to hold each plow. The plows which are well adapted for the work, were made at the Wilkinson Shops, Toronto Junction.

The steel rails, which are T shaped, are from the well known firm of the Carnegie Co., Pittsburgh, Pa. The rails are 30 feet in length, and each rail weighs about 600 lbs. The teams haul 6 rails at a time from the Richmond Hill station, G. T. R.

Warden Slater was in the village on Monday, looking after the interests of the county, relative to the laying of the electric railway track. County Engineer McDougall finished surveying the line on Tuesday to the northern limit of the village, and Manager Moyes was here Tuesday forenoon in the interests of the railway company. Reeve Pugsley has been kept busy seeing that the interests of the county and the village do not clash. We trust his efforts to please will be satisfactory to all con-. cerned.

At a meeting of the Board of Education on Tuesday a proposition was made to lower the teachers' salaries in the High and Public Schools, on the ground of economy. A By-Law to raise by way of loan, the sum of Twenty Thousand Donars over and above the sums required for the ordinary expenditure of the County of York.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the County of York deems it necessary to raise, by way of loan, the sum of Twenty Thousand Do lars for purposes over and above the sums required for the ordinary expenditure of the

AND WHEREAS it will require a total amount Dollars, and interest thereon at four per cent

per annum, pavable half yearly; AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole ratable property of the County of York according to the last revised and equalized assessment

AND WHERE AS the existing debenture debt of the County of York is \$30,229.74, and there is no principal or interest in arrears thereon; IT IS THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County

(1) It shall be lawful for the Warden of the County of York to raise by way of loan from any person or corporation who may be willing to advance the same upon the credit of the debentures hereinafter mentioned, the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars for purposes over and above the sums required for ordinary ex-
