DEATH OF AN OLD TORONTO PRINTER.

The Toronto papers announce the death, on Saturday, the 27th of February, of James Austin Esq., President of the Dominion Bank of Toronto, at the age of 84. Mr. Austin was born in the town of Tanderagee, County of Armagh Ireland and came to "Little York" (now Toronto) when a boy. He served his 'time in the printing office of the Colonial Advocate, published by the Jate Mr. William Lyon McKenzie, and was the "youngest apprentice in that office in the year 1830.
