CLOVERS

Lucerne or Alfalfa (Medicago Sativa). The great value of Lucerne is in its enormous field of sweet and nutritious foliage which is in by crushed by stock, either when green or cured into hay. It will grow and yield abundantly in low, dry sections, and on poor light and sandy land, where no other grasses can be grown for it sends its roots down to enormous depths, consequently it consumes food moisture and the leech of fertilizers which have been for years beyond the depths of ordinary plants. The best method is to sow broadcast 15 lbs. per acre where land is in good condition. Cut when in full bloom. Call and get prices and see samples.

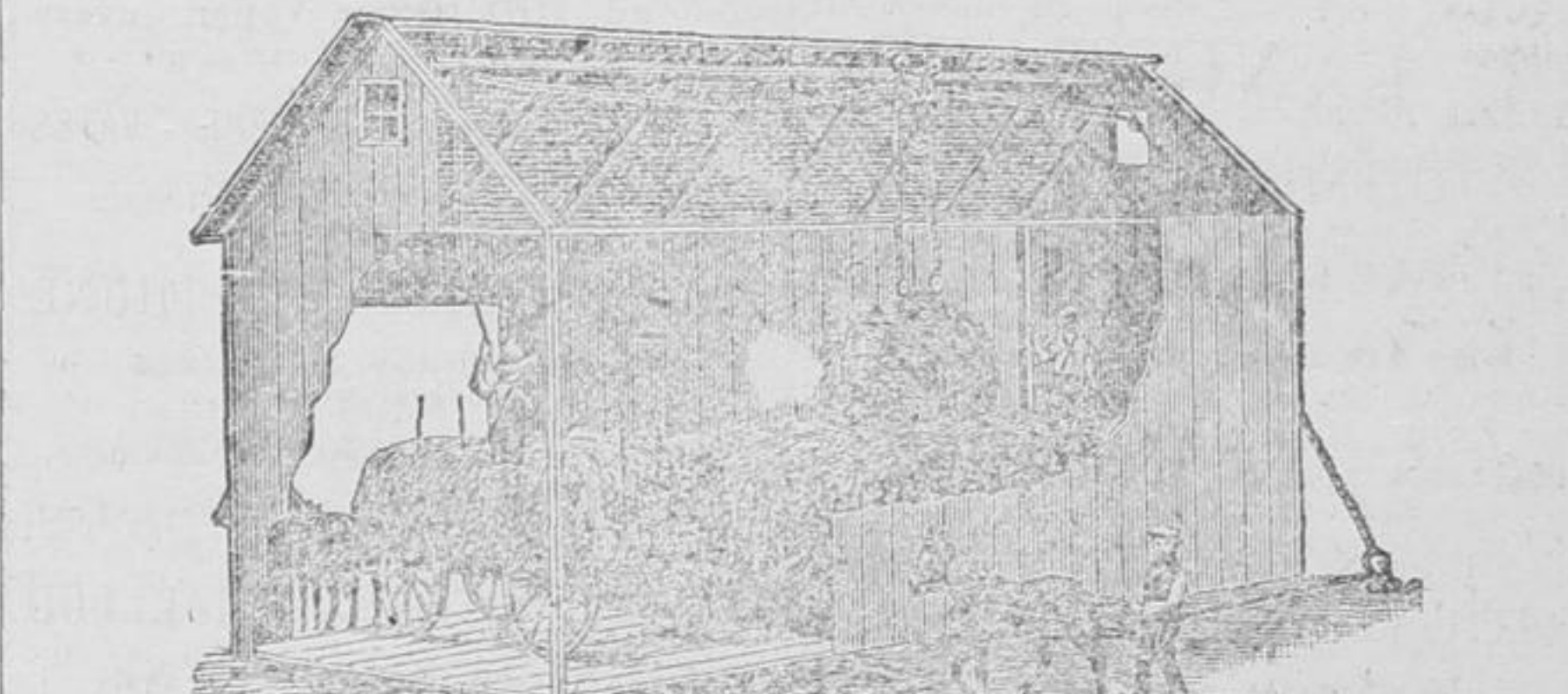
