

A RUSSIAN TELEPHONE.

According to L'Electricien, of Paris, a Russian scientist has invented a telephone far superior to anything hitherto used. With it a man may talk to more than one of his friends at a time, provided they are all in the same room, for it is not necessary to stand near the receiver in order to hear the sound. The voice issues from a metallic funnel, and may be heard at some distance. The new telephone has other advantages. Sounds transmitted through it lose very little of their intensity by reason of distance. In experiments made between Moscow and Rostof, a distance of eight hundred and seventy miles, speech, songs and music could be clearly heard. A large number of official people were present at the experiments, and the official report was full of praise of the new telephone.

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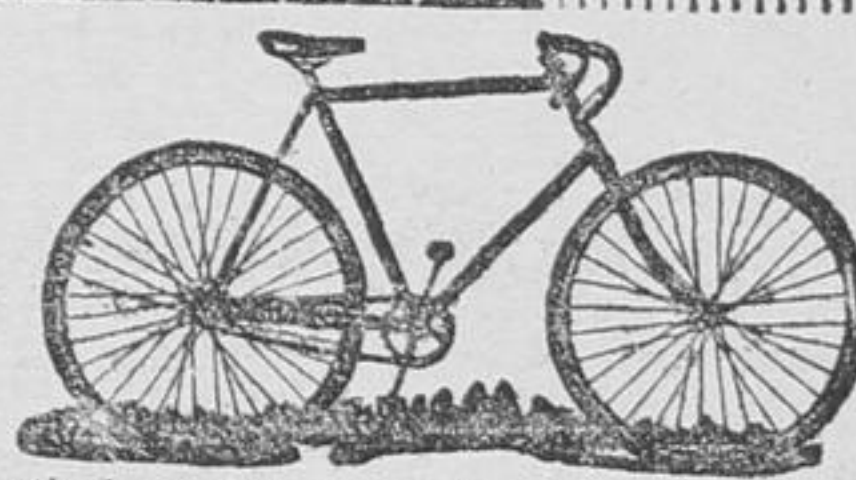
