RECIPE.

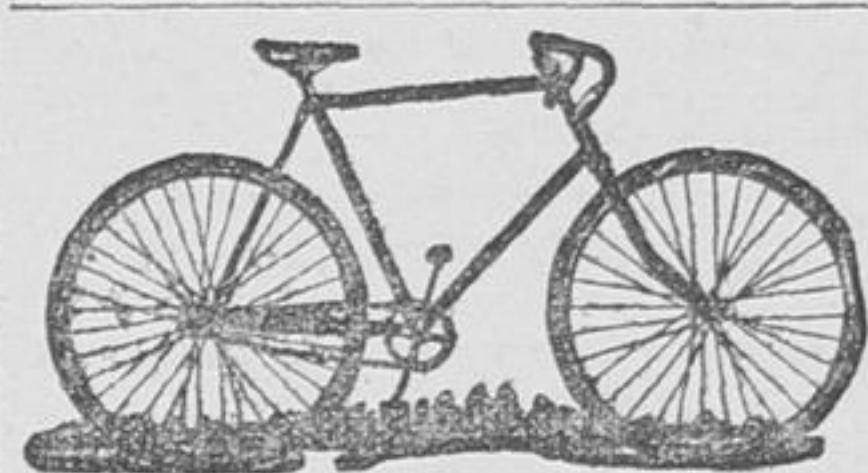
Adams Extract
