The man who labors with his hands is given to thinking that the brain worker's work is no work at all. The latter, on his part, is given to maintaining that his work is more fatiguing and wearing than manual labor. Mortality statistics do not bear out this idea, since the average of longevity is higher among professional men and statesmen than among the masses. 


