

**EXTRA-PROVINCIAL COMPANIES.**

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given that under the provisions of Section 104 of The Ontario Companies' Act, every company, NOT INCORPORATED BY OR UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF AN ACT OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ONTARIO, which now or prior to the first day of November, A. D. 1897, carries on business in Ontario, HAVING GAIN FOR ITS PURPOSE OR OBJECT, for the carrying on of which a company might be incorporated under the said Act, shall, on or before the first day of November, A. D. 1897, make out and transmit to the Provincial Secretary a statement, under oath, showing:

- (a) The corporate name of the company;
- (b) How and under what special or general Act the company was incorporated, and the Acts amending such special or general Act;
- (c) Where the head office of the company is situated;
- (d) The amount of the authorized capital stock;
- (e) The amount of stock subscribed or issued and the amount paid up thereon;
- (f) The nature of each kind of business which the company is empowered to carry on, and what kind or kinds is or are carried on in Ontario.

(1) If the company makes default in complying with the provisions of the said section it shall incur a penalty of twenty dollars per day for every day during which such default continues, and every director, manager, secretary, agent, traveller or salesman of such company who with notice of such default transacts within Ontario any business whatever for such company, shall for each day upon which he so transacts such business incur a penalty of twenty dollars.

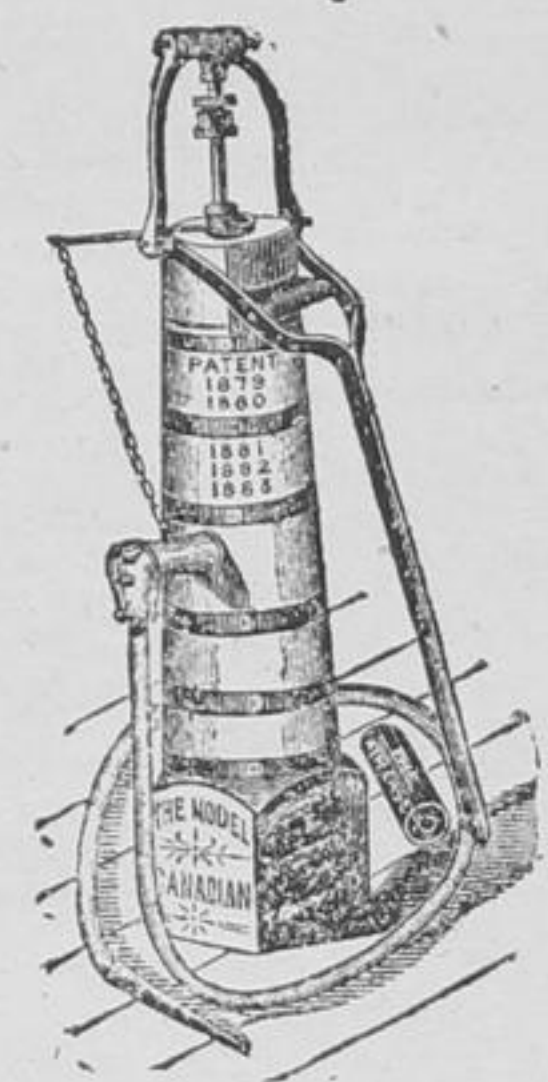
