CANADA LIFE'S NEW PRESIDENT.

As announced some time ago, the retirement of Mr. A. G. Ramsay from the offices of President and General Manager of the Canada Life Assurance Company took effect on the 31st of December. The Board of Directors at their first meeting of the year, held yesterday, on proceeding to fill the office of President elected the Vice-President, Mr. F. W. Gates of Hamilton, to that position.
