

BRITISH MONEY IN THIS.

A Railway Project to Save the Arctic Voy- age and Bring Siberia Nearer.
The discovery of good petroleum springs in the Province of Petchora, in Northeast Russia, has induced the government to send an expedition to the mouth of the Petchora River, which will examine it with a view to the construction of a harbor.

In close connection with this plan of building a harbor is the project entertained by a company of foreign capitalists, a company in which English money, too, is invested, of constructing, under the management of Herr Gotte, the engineer, a railway from the River Obi to the mouth of the Petchora, in order to spare English vessels the long and difficult voyage round to the mouth of the Obi, and to bring instead the raw products of Siberia down to the vessels at the mouth of the Petchora.

According to a report made to the Russian Government by Herr Gotte, who for a year past has been examining the "tundra" between the rivers of Obi and Petchora, it seems that the building of the line could be managed without any great expenditure of capital and consequently everything now depends on the report of the expedition, sent to find a place for a good harbor at the Petchora's mouth.

The realization of these projects, by assisting the export of Siberian produce will confer a great benefit upon England.

PRAISE FOR CANADA'S HORSES.

The Animals From Our North-West Stood the Trials of Campaigning Well.

Mr. George Lane, of Calgary, N.W. T., has received a letter from one of the veterinary staff of the Second Canadian Contingent, in which the following passage occurs:

"Out of the forty horses purchased from you only two casualties have taken place, one dying of sunstroke and another of dysentery. Our march of 600 miles was made under the most unfavorable conditions for horses, and I think I am not enlarging on the truth when I say that no other class of horses in the world could have stood the misery and hardships which our North-West horses went through since they left Halifax. After 8,000 miles of sea voyage, without any exercise and very little feed, a week's rest at Cape Town on a hot sandbank, five days packed up in small close cars, and then sent away on a 600 mile trip with poor feed and water and a heavy load. Still we can muster a larger percentage of horses to-day that are fit for duty than any other mounted corps which landed in South Africa this year. The North-West horses are the best in the world."
